### **General Rules**

AGE: The age of an Individual on Dec 1, 2018 is maintained the entire year. For horse show purposes, a horse becomes one year old on January 1 following actual foaling date.

AWARDS: Ribbons first through fifth will be awarded for each class. High Score or High Points will be awarded as listed.

CHANGES: Show Management reserves the right to combine/cancel classes; to accept entries for unfilled classes at regular fee; to substitute listed officials. Exhibitors will be advised if classes are combined, canceled.

CONDUCT: Show committee reserves the right to refuse any entry of an exhibitor or the participation of any agent, trainer, rider or driver who has shown an objectionable attitude toward a Recognized Show or previous unsportsmanlike behavior at a Recognized Show or to its Management.

SCHOOLING EQUIPMENT: Schooling equipment is allowed for the Hunter Series shows only, proper attire is required for exhibitors entering the Dressage Series Show per USDF rules and regulations. <a href="https://www.usdf.com">www.usdf.com</a>

ENTRIES must be in writing, signed by owner/authorized agent, and accompanied by proper fees. Parent/Guardian must sign the entry of a junior exhibitor.

PRE-ENTRY CLOSING DATE: Must be <u>received</u> 5 days before the show, late entries taken in office at show with a 5.00 post entry fee assessed per horse.

There is no fee for non-WSH exhibitors, for those riding for WSH/NEZ points, please provide your WSH member number on the entry.

JUDGES: No one shall approach a Judge with regard to a decision unless he/she first obtains permission from Show Committee, who shall arrange an appointment at a proper time and place. The decision of a Judge is final.

LOSS AND INJURY: **Washington State Horseman**, its members, members of the Show Committee, PFEC, their employees and associates will not be responsible for any loss of damage or injury to horses exhibited, or for any articles of any kind that may be lost or destroyed, are in any way injured. Each exhibitor will be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person, whomever, by any horse owned or exhibited by him and shall indemnify **WSH** its members, members of the Show Committee, PFEC their employees and associates against all claims and demands of any kind or nature that may grow out of occasioned by any horse owned or exhibited by him, or arise from the negligence of the person in charge of any such horse. The owner, rider/driver and any of their agents or representative acknowledge that they participate voluntarily in the competition fully or representatives acknowledge

that they participate voluntarily in the competition fully aware that horse sports and the competition involve inherent dangerous risk and by participating they expressly assume any and all risks of injury or loss, and they agree to hold competition and its officials, employees and agents harmless for any injury of loss suffered during or in connection with the competition, whether or not such injury or loss resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligent acts or omissions of said officials, directors, employees or agents. All horses exhibited will be entirely at the owner's risk. Submitting entry shall constitute acceptance by the owner and exhibitor of all provisions as set forth herein. **WSH**, its members, members of the Show Committee, PFEC, their employees and associates cannot be held liable for loss or injury to the person or property of any visitor, guest, or spectator.

NUMBERS: Exhibitors must appear in the ring suitably attired, with correct number on, clearly visible to the judge at all times when in competition. Entries with incorrect or missing numbers may be eliminated.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: All riders under 18 must wear protective headgear (recommend for adults also) while riding in the designated schooling, exercise arenas and the show ring. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at anytime must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. USEF strongly encourages all riders to wear protective headgear passing or surpassing current applicable ASTM standards with harnesses secured while riding anywhere on the grounds. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian wear, and is properly fitted and in good condition and the USEF, WSH Show Committees, and Licensed Officials are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance.

PROTEST: A protest must be written, signed, addressed to the Show Secretary, received by Steward, Show Manager, Show Secretary, or Member of Show Committee within 48 hours of the occurrence of the violation.
